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Naka Matsuzawa is chief strategist for the Market Strategy Research team at Nomura Securities, Tokyo. He constructs cross asset investment strategies, centered on G3 fixed income markets. He began his career in 1990 in the Economic Research Department of Nomura Research Institute, Tokyo, as an economist focusing on the US economy and the US Treasury market. In 1995 he was promoted to the position of investment strategist for the Japanese stock market in the same department. In 1996, Naka joined Nomura Securities and for the next three years worked as an investment strategist in the Debt Market Department specializing in the yen rates market and currency markets.
